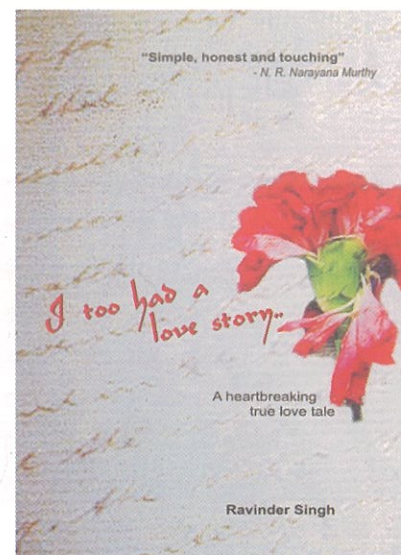


I wish my Love story continued...
